## Training Program

This systematic language training program strives to increase knowledge and effectiveness in working with students who have dyslexia and language learning delays. It will also benefit all teachers because the techniques are effective with every student.

**Subscriber Course** - A two-day course intended to introduce parents, teachers, and administrators to the Orton-Gillingham approach, the phonology and structure of English, plus the characteristics of dyslexia, multisensory teaching, and lesson planning.

Cost: \$125. Includes a one-year membership to AOGPE.

**Associate Level Course** - An intense weeklong course for individuals holding a bachelor's degree. It is the basic course in the Orton-Gillingham approach, enabling instruction with better understanding of the structure of language and multisensory teaching. The course comprises an in depth introduction to phonology, structure of English, characteristics of dyslexia, multisensory teaching, assessment tools, grammar and written expression. It includes interactive demonstrations and activities using the O-G method. A practicum is available upon request (additional cost) which includes observations and mentoring.

Cost: \$1,000.00. Includes textbooks and lodging.

**Certified, Part 1 Course** - An additional weeklong intense training that is geared to solidify concepts and theories learned in Associate Level training followed by more in-depth exposure to English structure. More emphasis is placed on assessment analysis, vocabulary and comprehension skills, written expression, and prefixes, roots, and suffixes. A practicum is available (additional cost) which includes observations and mentoring.

Cost: \$1,000.00. Includes textbooks and lodging.

**Certified, Part 2 Course** - This course is the second half of the Certified, which comprises an additional intense weeklong training. The focus is on solidifying gaps in knowledge of the Orton-Gillingham approach. Participants will learn how to engage in more analytical thinking, improve their assessment skills, and develop higher level strategies for college bound students. At this level participants extend their focus on morphology, expository writing, vocabulary development, and analogies. Preparing and presenting lectures is also part of the curriculum. A practicum is available upon request (additional cost) which includes observations and mentoring.

Cost: \$1,000.00. Includes textbooks and lodging.

## A Note to Participants

Participants should be highly motivated individuals with a desire to become more effective advocates and educators of dyslexic students. These intensive courses provide opportunities for a variety of hands-on experiences designed to advance understanding of the underlying principles and specific procedures of the Orton-Gillingham approach to evaluation and remediation.

These courses are designed to fulfill partial requirements leading to certification by the Academy of Orton-Gillingham Practitioners and Educators. Course work is based on the curriculum and objectives of the Academy (AOGPE).
